## P\&C NEWS

What a fabulous turn up we had for our P\&C meeting on Tuesday afternoon. We had 10 members for the meeting which was the largest group that I'm aware for a number of years. A number of ideas were discussed in
relation to fundraising, canteen, Presentation Night and the wearing of shoes at school. I hope the high number of attendees is a positive sign for future get-togethers. Thanks everybody!
A couple of changes have been made to the canteen roster which will come into effect as of next Monday (29 Oct). From next Monday both the noodles and the chicken and gravy roll will be removed from the canteen menu. The main reason for the change is the low number of students who order these food items, and in the case of the noodles in particular, it concerns the nutritional value.
The second change is that students will have a limit on the amount of lollies they can purchase from the canteen at lunchtime. A 50 cent limit will be placed on the amount of lollies students can buy. There was a general consensus that this amount buys a sufficient amount of lollies any child needs to eat in one sitting and it's suitably enough for students to consume in the remaining lunch time available before returning to class.
